- The AFC is the lifeline for Canada's entertainment industry. We provide compassionate aid to Canadian entertainment professionals working in all aspects of film, TV, music, theatre & dance.
- Previously known as the Actors' Fund of Canada, we have evolved our brand to help Canadian entertainment professionals understand that what we do is by, for, and about them.
- What does The AFC stand for? It used to stand for the Actors' Fund of Canada, but now we're simply "The AFC." If you work in Canada's entertainment industry, The AFC stands for you.
- The AFC is supported by many unions and guilds, but is an independent organization with its own policies and procedures. **Information provided to The AFC is confidential.**
- The AFC can provide emergency assistance with costs of necessities to help entertainment professionals maintain their health, housing, or ability to work.
- Who is eligible to apply for help from The AFC?

Canadian entertainment professionals who have:

- Earned more than half their income working in any aspect of the Canadian entertainment industry over the past three years
- Earned the majority of their income from the Canadian entertainment industry, if over 65
- Experienced an unforeseeable emergency (such as injury, illness or other severe personal or professional hardship) that has led to a financial crisis
- Made reasonable efforts to find other means of income or support

- The AFC works quickly to respond to immediate emergencies. Once an application is complete it typically takes one to two weeks to determine if or how we can help.
- The AFC is an expression of the community's good will supported by unions and guilds and industry organizations, community fundraising and individual donors.
- The AFC can help with basic necessities like:
 - Rent or mortgage payments to prevent homelessness
 - · Grocery costs
 - Transportation costs
 - · Medical costs
 - Emergency dental costs
 - · Utility bills
 - Dues
 - · Phone and internet
 - Childcare expenses
 - Emergency relocation, moving, or travel costs
