#### **How the Co-op Program Works**

- Apply through your Cooperative Education teacher, who will submit a central application to the Central Cooperative Experiential Learning CCEL system.
- 4-credit Co-op at a production placement (this is only for semester schools and shifts will be 9:00 am to 9:00 pm) or 4-credit Co-op at an office placement within the film, television, new media sector (this is for both semester and non-semester schools).
- Classes and Co-op placements operate Monday through Friday.
- In-school classes provide training in WHMIS and Ministry of Labour 4 Step Workers Health and Safety Awareness Program.
- The Co-op teacher and the Student Outreach Program Manager for xoTO schools will meet with students to discuss progress and ensure success during their placement period.



# **Who Can Apply?**

- Students who are at least 16 years old
- Students who have at least 16 credits
- Students who have an interest in the film, television and new media industry
- Students must commit to production shift hours

# **How Can You Apply?**

- Pick up an application package in the Co-op or Student Services Department at your school.
- Discuss the program with your parent(s) or guardian.
- \* Talk to your school's Co-op teacher.
- Have your Co-op teacher submit your completed xoTO schools application through the CCEL system.
